This month we will look at the spiritual discipline of meditation. Instead of giving a theological appraisal of meditation or expositing the benefits of meditation, I thought it would be most helpful to offer everyone one of the methods for meditating on Scripture, through which I feel, has benefited my spiritual growth.

Meditation on Scripture

Opening Prayer:

Dear Lord,

I need you more than ever. Therefore I place myself at your feet, as one of Your the disciples. Lord Jesus, please reveal the message that You have for me, as I search the Scriptures this day. In the precious name of Jesus, Amen

Wait patiently:

Pray and open the Scriptures, looking and listening until you come to a passage or passages to which you feel God leading.

Preparation:

Open your Bible to the passage on which you have been led to meditate:

Sit still and straight-up, with both feet flat to the floor. In a series of flexing and relaxing movements begin by flexing your toes and them allowing them to relax. Move to your feet, calves, and thighs, and so on, up your body, flexing and relaxing each muscle as you go. As you flex inhale and as you relax exhale. Feel the stress of the day disappear.

Notice your breathing. Feel and become aware of each breath.

Allow yourself to connect to your surroundings, by increasing your awareness of things, sounds, smells, and textures that are apparent at that very moment. Stay in the moment. Don't think of the past or the future, just focus on the gift of the moment. Allow thoughts to move in and out of your mind freely. Do not attach to any specific thought.

Now as if lifting a veil or removing a blindfold, recognize the presence of God in your midst and place yourself before God. Be as someone waiting for an amazing gift, lesson, or revelation.

**Read God's Word (the one you have chosen), as it is being spoken from
God directly to you:**

Pray for the Lord to assist you, that you may hear God's Word in your heart Allow the Word of God to penetrate and adhere to your spirit. A prayer such as the following may be right for this special time with the Lord.

Dear Lord,

Open my heart that I may hear you grace filled Word fresh and anew. I place myself before You Lord Jesus that I may surrender my most inner being to your love. I pray Lord that the Word's of love and grace that You offer me now penetrate and adhere to my spirit. May Your Word by the power of the Holy Spirit, move me in such a way that I grow closer to who you. Lord help me to be all that You have called me to be. In the precious and glorious name of Jesus Christ I pray. Amen

Feel God's love being poured out on you as you listen intently to the Holy Word.

Compose the scene:

Place yourself in the Biblical narrative. How does the scene described in the Scripture inform things such as, where you are standing? Who is around you? What is the weather like? What do you hear, smell, taste, feel as you sit before the Lord who is speaking to you?

How are you being affected by the images around you, as those images relate to the life of Jesus and the message of the Gospel?

What actions do you feel you may be called to perform? Listen to God's promptings that come to mind as a result of this experience of God's Word?

Conclusion:

Offer a prayer of Thanksgiving:

Dear Lord,

Thank you for your Word. Thank you for this particular experience of Your Word, and thank you for the lesson, guidance and revelation that You have provided through this particular experience of Your Holy Word. Thank you Lord. In the precious name of Jesus I pray, Amen.

Offer the results of the meditation experience back to God:

Dear Lord,

I acknowledge that Your presence has changed me. Lord I offer back to You the results of this meditation that You may empower me to go forth and be obedient to its message to me. Lord I ask

For the strength to _____ (fill in the blank based on your experience. i.e., *pray more, help the poor, seek you more, be a better witness etc...*).

Ask yourself: What is a good first step that I can make today, in an effort toward the fulfillment of the guidance I have received from God?

Spiritual Nosegay: Write down the message, word, idea, and/or direction that you have received. Place it in your pocket, wallet, pocketbook (somewhere that it will be available to you during the day) and look at it often throughout the day, especially during stressful or difficult times.
